A key component in building the accessibility plan was community consultation. A successful action plan needs input from community members, especially those living with a disability or people who work with individuals with disabilities. The Accessibility Advisory Committee used two key methods to obtain community input. An accessibility survey was conducted and the committee hosted a virtual conference.

The survey was conducted online using the Town of Yarmouth's Get Involved platform, and paper copies were also made available at a number of locations. The survey consisted of seven questions designed to scope out views on how the Town of Yarmouth fares in terms of barriers people face when using municipal buildings or public spaces and accessing goods and services.

In total, there were 44 responses to the survey divided equally amongst online and paper submissions. The complete results of those responses can be found on the pages that follow, and they offer a variety of perspectives on physical barriers people face in the built environment, issues faced with services such as transit, and more. They also offer up positives on what is already being done well in Yarmouth, as well as some ideas on how improvements can be made.

A Few Key Findings:

- 1) A significant number of respondents were in the 65+ age demographic.
- 2) By a significant margin, respondents reported access to public buildings, sidewalks and trails as a key area for future focus and improvements.
- 3) A significant number of respondents reported concerns around accessing buildings and services not under the control of the Town of Yarmouth.

The first three pages preceding the actual responses contain graphs that summarize some demographic information as well as a graph that offers a strong visual around access to buildings, sidewalks and trails.







Ramp at lake Milo on swimming side is WAY too steep. This is a HUGE HSE issue and what person allowed this UNSAFE ramp is beyond me. It needs to be elongated and the slope of 30+ degrees is too much. Look into industry standards and you will see this is unacceptable. There used to be a much longer ramp there that made getting in easier. There are also WAY too few ladders in the swimming area for kids to get out making it further dangerous. Ask the lifeguards, they will echo this. I spoke with them this summer, they had all the same concerns. Also look into main docks there, there is now preparations large enough anyone will trip on, if it were a sidewalk it would be torn out and redone. Might be smart to get what is there at Milo right FIRST, and then get into this big renovation plan.

Community Consultation Report Part 2: Virtual Conference



September 21st, 2021



Virtual Conference: Quick Summary

On September 21st, 2021, the Accessibility Advisory Committee hosted a virtual conference. Community members were invited to join on-line with committee members to answer questions included in the accessibility survey, and to openly discuss some of the issues in both controlled breakout sessions, and a final closing session involving all participants.

The meeting allowed for participants to provide feedback based on the same questions asked in the survey. The first part of the event allowed participants to answer some basic demographic information through an on-line poll, and to express which destinations within the town required the most attention. Summary information from that poll is in graph form on the next page.


Overall, the event was well received and valuable feedback was obtained that directly impacted the contents of the Accessibility Action Plan.

Here are a few summary points from the event:

- 1) Much like the accessibility survey responses, participants voiced that a key focus needs to be placed on public buildings, sidewalks, and multi-use trails.
- 2) Access to public washrooms and ones that are not accessible (not enough space to maneuver).
- 3) Issues around sidewalks - for example, cobble sidewalk is difficult for wheelchair users and some sidewalks have breaks that create challenges.
- 4) SeeClickFix was mentioned as a way to report issues to the town. This tool could serve as an important tool for reporting accessibility issues.
- 5) Some participants voiced concerns around sidewalk clearing and snow removal.


